

## Nova Scotia College of Chiropractors Guidelines: Application of Therapeutic Modalities

- 1. Doctors of Chiropractic apply their diagnostic skill and clinical judgement to determine appropriate adjunctive therapies. The application of adjunctive therapies is at the discretion and is the responsibility of the treating chiropractor
- 2. A chiropractic assistant (or staff member) applying adjunctive therapies under the direction and license of the chiropractor, must be adequately trained in the application of the therapy provided.
- 3. The treating chiropractor must be on site for all adjunctive therapy and modality applications.
- 4. All equipment used with adjunctive therapy procedures must be maintained and in proper working order.
- 5. Equipment must be legally available for sale in Canada as approved by Health Canada.
